

I would like to thank PDG John Shwed for his help and guidance.

LVRF (Lions Vision Research Foundation) (http://www.lionsvision.org/)

The LVRF mission is to support the Wilmer Eye Institute at Johns Hopkins in the areas of LOW VISION to include clinical services education research.

Low vision is defined as visual acuity of 20/50 or worse in the better eye while wearing glasses or contact lenses and/or blind spots or loss of peripheral vision that interferes with the performance of everyday activities.

Lions Low Vision Rehabilitation Center

Through the Lions Vision Center (LVC), the Lions Vision Research Foundation and Wilmer are committed to supporting low vision research and rehabilitation to minimize the disability caused by low vision and blindness. The Center's professional staff includes physicians, optometrists, research scientists, rehabilitation therapists, and ophthalmic technicians. Together they have created a low vision rehabilitation program that has become a model for clinics elsewhere.

UDG TOMMY LU'S MESSAGE - CONTINUED

The LVC has three integrated missions: research and development, education, and patient care in low vision (uncorrectable vision loss). All three missions brought to bear on the search for an understanding of the causes of low vision, better management of patients, and, ultimately, effective treatments.

What the Center Offers:

At the Low Vision Rehabilitative Service, a multidisciplinary team of doctors and rehabilitative specialists works closely with the patient, family, friends, and the referring doctor to assist an individual in regaining function lost by visual impairment. This typically includes addressing vision issues such as diabetic retinopathy, glaucoma, and macular degeneration, which cause problems with reading, driving and activities of daily living.

Major fundraiser events:

Aim for Sight – a fun sporting clays shooting event for LVRF. One is offered in the eastern shore at the Schrader's Outdoors, 16090 Oakland Rd., Henderson, MD on 10/15/2022 and the other one is offered in the western shore at the Maryberry Road Shooters, 2555 Mayberry Rd., Westminster, MD on 9/24/2022

Challenge grant for Endowment Fund Fellowship at the Wilmer Eye Institute. Our very own Pike Creek – Green Hills Lions Club has challenged MD 22 clubs to match dollar for dollar contribution to a maximum of \$30,000. The challenge period is between 9/1/2022 and 12/1/2022. In addition, if 90% of the clubs contribute at least \$50 to LVRF, the Pike Creek – Green Hills Lions Club will donate additional \$1,000 to the district.

Delaware Lions Sight Team Eyeglass Sorting Procedure

- 1. Collect eye glasses from collection points in your club's service area.
- 2. Sort out all hard eyeglass cases. These are not needed. Place soft cases in a separate box.
- 3. Sort out all individual lenses and discard.
- 4. Sort out all broken frames and frames with one missing lens and discard them.
- 5. Sort frames without both lenses into a separate container. Mark container: Frames Only.
- 6. Separate glasses that appear to be children's frames and place in a separate container. Mark the container: <u>Small</u> <u>frames.</u>

7. Sunglasses and clip ons are <u>NOT</u> to be included with the glasses that are to be sent to the prison! <u>This is per the</u> <u>Sussex Correctional Institute staff</u>. Separate sunglasses in a box; do not include with other glasses. Discard clip ons.

8. Any glasses that appear to be gold plated or gold filled, inspect for engraving on the inside of the bridge and ear pieces. ex. COC 1/10-12K GF. Place these frames in a separate container and label as Gold Frames. These can be recycled for the gold.

Count and place glasses in a sturdy card board box.

DO NOT PLACE IN PLASTIC BAGS. Boxes only, please!

10. Record the number of glasses inside each box and identify the name of Lions Club.

Contact DLST Chairman for coordination of getting glasses delivered to storage unit, currently located in Milton, Delaware. Chairman's number will be listed in District Roster Book. Glasses will be taken to Georgetown for neutralizing by the prisoners at Sussex Correctional Center.

LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION

Now that "Campaign 100" is over, it is time to figure how District 22 D can participate in using these funds to better serve those in our communities who need our help. Worldwide Campaign 100 raised over \$325 Million and District 22 D raised \$629,266 which was 266% over our goal.

There is still a need to continue to support LCIF this year and District Governor Daniel Marney Elkins will be setting the LCIF goals for this year along with his two LCIF Co-Coordinators, PDG Karl Gude and myself, PDG Ken Chew. We all know of the continuing needs for our world and even places nearer to our own communities, like Ukraine War Refugees and the floods in Kentucky.

Your own local communities have people who need our help and LCIF can provide funding for these local projects through the DCG grants. Some clubs with District support have use these grants to support local club projects like the Spot Camera (\$8,000) that the Bellefonte Lions Club purchased; the Equestrian project for blind persons (\$800) that the Pike Creek – Green Hills completed, and the most recent project, the Topcon SL-D701 LED /Slit Lamp (\$10,890) that was purchased for the Eye Bank of Delaware Valley. These projects were made possible with Club and District Contribution to LCIF.


