

<u>VDG TOMMY LU'S MESSAGE</u>



Hello, Lions of 22-D:

I went back to Taiwan in September for three weeks to visit my parents who are now in a long term care facility. While I was there, I met a cabinet member of LCTF (Lions Clubs Taiwan Foundation). She told me that Taiwan (MD300) is considering splitting into 5 multiple districts in order to better serve more than 50,000 Lions. How big is Taiwan? Well, Taiwan is about 7 times larger than Delaware (13,976 sq. miles vs. 1,982 sq. miles) but with a population of 23,000,000. Surprisingly, except for the multiple district itself, most clubs do not have active websites. I looked up the closest Lions Club to visit and could not find its contact information online. Fortunately, through my brother-in-law, I met Ms. Wang from LCTF in Taipei. She shared many success stories and most of them attributed to active members willing to step up either take initiatives or respond to requests.

One particular interested establishment in Taiwan is TLU (not my initial, ha!) Taiwan Lions University (https://www.lionstlu.org/2223/). Lions can register to attend either inperson or online courses and there are full of activities link on this

website. It looks like hybrid format is more popular now after pandemic and a lot of conferences, universities, and even middle and high schools are adopting this model. I know we can register and take self-paced courses on LCI but perhaps we can also consider some hybrid events for our district or multiple districts. I know it is a lot of work and investment but let's think about that.

This month I would like to refresh Lions Eye Bank of Delaware Valley (LEBDV) Foundation. I would like to thank PDG Keith Thompson and Jerilyn Giardina from LEBDV for their help and guidance.

Lions Eye Bank of Delaware Valley (https://lebdv.org/)

Lions Eye Bank of Delaware Valley (LEBDV) is committed to enhancing a person's quality of life by restoring or improving vision through cornea transplantation, medical research and education. It was founded by a small group of Lions from the tri-state area answering the call from Helen Keller to become "Knights of the Blind" in 1957 and has helped coordinate more than 48,000 surgeries covering Delaware, New Jersey, and southeast Pennsylvania areas.

LEBDV has grown from one or two cornea donors per year to over 800. Selfless cornea donors restore sight and hope to around 1,000 cornea transplants recipients every year. LEBDV has now 18 professional staff members with an annual budget of over \$5 million dollars.

LEBDV is responsible for recovering, processing and distributing cornea tissue for sight-restoring transplantation. Technicians travel to hospitals and other facilities to recover donor tissue. The tissue is screened, evaluated, and processed in the LEBDV lab to ensure its quality and safety for transplant. When a surgeon has a patient in need of a cornea transplant, LEBDV is contacted and coordinated for the surgery. If the patient does not have the financial resources to pay, LEBDV provides gratis (donated) tissue to support the patient in need. Founded by the values of Lionism, LEBDV believes ability to pay should never be a barrier to a person's ability to see.

VDG TOMMY LU'S MESSAGE - CONTINUED

Awards and Recognitions:

Gene Polgar Fellowship – this is the highest honor of the Endowment Fund to recognize an individual or group donates \$1,000 or more. The recipient is presented with a lapel pin, an inscribed crystal award as a PID Gene Polgar Fellow and an inscription on a plaque displayed in the Eye Bank's office entry foyer.

Life Membership – a non-transferrable life membership to any individual who makes a contribution of \$100 or more. The recipient receives an embossed membership card and gold lapel pin. The Giving Tree Fund – the tree is adorned with leaves of bronze (\$200 donation), silver (\$300 donation), and gold (\$500 donation) and a large faux stone (\$1,000 donation). The Giving Tree is a permanent fixture displayed in the Eye Bank's foyer.




<u>REGION ONE</u> ZONE PROJECT






