

This month I would like to refresh our own foundation: Delaware Lions Foundation.

Delaware Lions Foundation (DLF) (http://www.delawarelionsfoundation.org/)

Delaware Lions Foundation is our own foundation in 22-D. It was established in 1973 as the Delaware Lions Sight and Hearing Conservation Foundation. At the 2001 Convention, the mission statement was updated to provide more opportunities for local clubs to serve their communities in addition to their support of the traditional sight and hearing projects. The mission of the Delaware Lions Foundation is to support the Lions Clubs of Delaware in their humanitarian service to Delawareans through matching grants and to provide educational scholarships for Public High School seniors residing in Delaware.

Any Delaware Lions, Lioness, or Leo Club can submit for grant requests. If a zone wishes to submit a grant request as a result of a zone project, one club in the zone should submit the grant request on behalf of the zone. A Project Completion Report should be filed once the project is finished.

Graduating high school seniors residing in Delaware and attending public high school in Delaware are eligible to apply for James A. McCarty Memorial Scholarship. Applicants must demonstrate exceptional involvement in community service and good leadership skills. Applicants must also have high scholastic achievement and demonstrate financial need. Scholarship recipients will receive \$1,000 scholarship paid directly to the college of award recipient's choice.

VDG TOMMY LU'S MESSAGE - CONTINUED

The Ralph Helm Fellowship was established in 1992 to honor Past International Director Ralph N. Helm for his many years of dedicated service to his district and the international community. Donations for Ralph Helm Fellowships go to provide project assistance to the Lions Clubs of Delaware.

The James McCarty Fellowship was established in 2005 to honor Past International Director James A. McCarty for his many years of dedicated service to his district and the international community. Donations for James McCarty Fellowships are used to provide scholarships to high school seniors in public schools in Delaware.

The Ted Reiver Fellowship was established in 2019 to honor Past International Director Ted Reiver for his many years of dedicated service to his district and the international community. Donations for Ted Reiver Fellowships go to provide assistance for Vision Projects to the Lions Clubs of Delaware.

Bronze - \$100 donation

Gold - \$500 donation

About the Deep Creek Lake Lions Club and the Blind Skiers Program

Since 1972, the Deep Creek Lake Lions Club has been holding its Blind Skier Program. Over the history of this program, the Club estimates that hundreds of visually impaired children have learned to downhill ski. Each year, the Club typically hosts 3 or 4 groups of visually impaired children and their families for three day sessions from Monday to Wednesday. The Club pays or arranges donation for all expenses for the trips.

At the beginning of each session, the Skiers are set up with equipment and lift tickets provided by Wisp Resort, and are matched up with their volunteer Ski Guides. Barb Law, long-time coordinator for the high-school ski guides, said that the "high-schoolers get an early opportunity in life to experience the rewards of service to others." The high school volunteers can also earn service learning hours along with excused absence from school.





The adaptive skiing process usually starts with the Blind Skier standing between two Guides who hold a padded bamboo pole for stability. Skiers who demonstrate the desire and ability to control their speed and direction can graduate to tethered skiing behind a Guide and eventually skiing with a Guide giving directions for turning and stopping. When snow conditions are favorable, the Club provides snowmobile riding to the family groups.

Meals are also an important part of the Program. Volunteers arrive each morning of the Program at the donated lodging to cook breakfast for the skiers, which provides an opportunity for Club members, the Skiers and their families to get to know each other. "While this Program is great for our visually impaired children," said one of the parents, "it's also a respite for our entire family since we can turn our kids loose with the Lions Club and enjoy skiing on our own for a bit."

In the summer, the Club provides the Blind Camp Program, which involves camping, boating, hiking and other outdoor activities. Additional service to the community is provided by the Club through financial assistance to residents for vision-related healthcare, donations to local organizations, and operation of the public park on Bumble Bee Rd. Future projects include the building of Garrett County's first all-inclusive playground and the reconstruction of an early 1800's log cabin.

The Deep Creek Lions Club will be holding a Gala event for the 50th anniversary of the Blind Skier Program on **Tuesday February 7th, 2023 at the Wisp Resort.** Since 1973, the Club has been providing visually impaired youth with the opportunity to learn to downhill ski through this program. *Please help support* our many community activities and celebrate our 50th anniversary for the Blind Skier Program by sponsoring the gala celebration.










CAPITOL CITY LIONS CLUB

The meal was delicious as it always is at Harpoon Hanna's and for dessert, we had decorated cupcakes supplied by the club.


DG Daniel provided us with an inspiring speech about how "We can do it." He made suggestions as to ways to serve and ways to fundraise that are fun and interesting.




MILTON LIONS CLUB


